Data to Decisions: A Workshop on Business Analytics for Decision Making

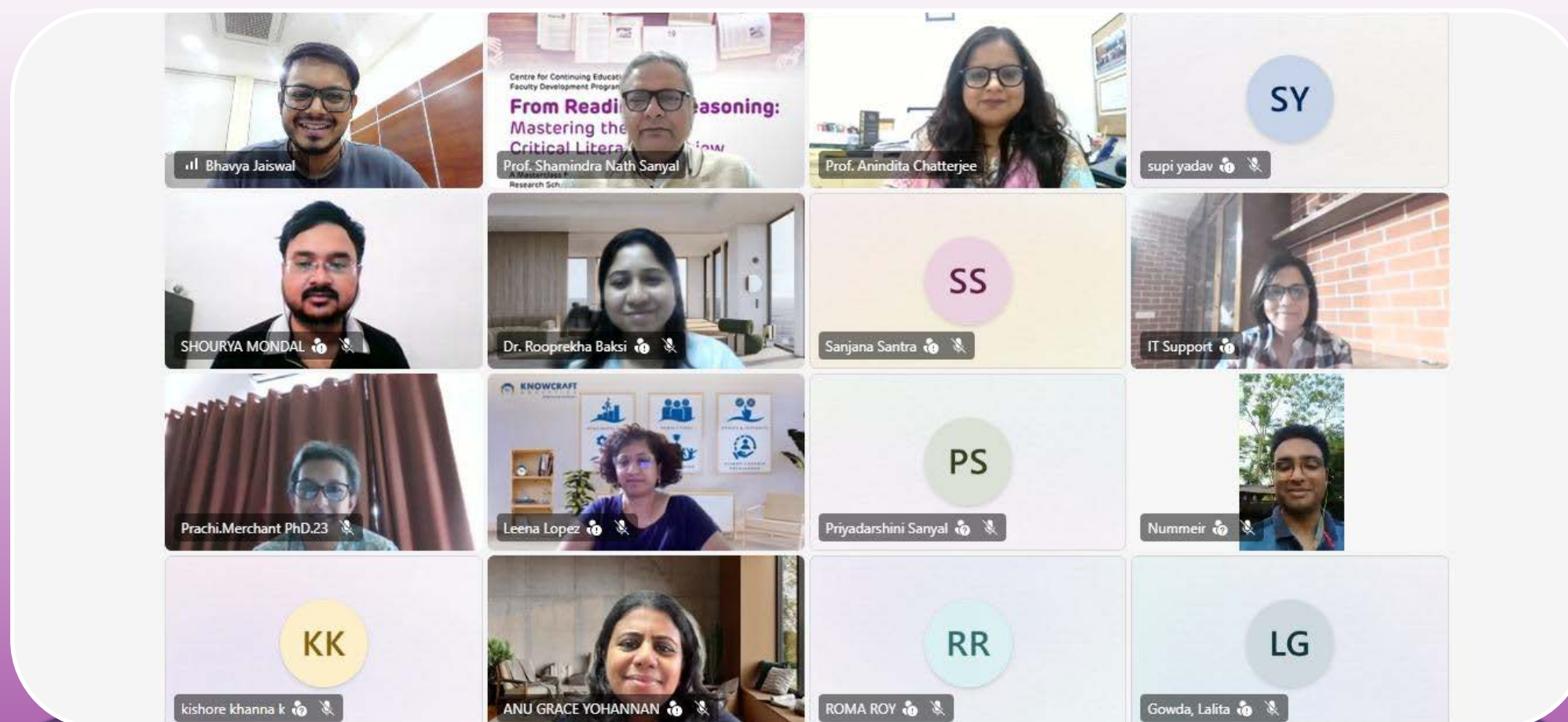
